In September 2016, the Rev. Canon Timothy M. Dombek became rector of Advent Episcopal Church in Sun City West, Arizona; he also serves part-time as Canon for Stewardship and Planned Giving for the Diocese of Arizona. Timothy and his family moved to Arizona in late 2007, when Timothy became Canon to the Ordinary for Bishop Kirk Smith, a position he held for six years before becoming Canon for Stewardship and Planned Giving in 2013. Prior to arriving in Arizona, Timothy served as rector of St. James Episcopal Church in Greenville, South Carolina.

In 2014, along with co-author Michael Durall, Timothy published the book, *Making the Annual Pledge Drive Obsolete: How Churches Can Get Out of This Business Once and For All*, available from VitalCongregations.com and for Kindle at Amazon.com.

While serving as Canon for Stewardship and Planned Giving in the Diocese of Arizona, Timothy created and regularly presents, “Stewardship University™”, a one day set of workshops designed to transform the way clergy and lay leaders look at and think about financial stewardship for congregations, and to provide practical steps that can be implemented to bring about generous giving, based on gratitude and gladness.
